Services at AHP are free and available to anyone regardless of the unique personal characteristics that distinguish us as individuals and groups or an ability to pay. The AHP KaRMA (Kindness and Resources Manifesting Action) Campaign invites community members to take action and invest KaRMA into the communities we serve. The variety of services include helping individuals understand health insurance, workshops to support self-management of chronic conditions, and care coordination to help individuals access important healthcare and social services.

Giving Support to Youth Today



Camp Zanika is the ideal location for kids to learn new skills, have fun, make friends and create memories that will last a lifetime. Youth will also experience the great outdoors firsthand (and unplugged) with guided explorations of our trails, lakes and woods. Your donation goes directly to adding an inclusion counselor to our summer camp program and helping us update our boys' bathroom. This past summer has taught us that we need to help some youth learn to interact with each other and learn to work through their problems. Inclusion has always been a value at Camp Fire and we are taking another step forward to create equitable and inclusive spaces in our programs and especially at Camp Zanika. An inclusion counselor will work with youth with physical and/or cognitive disabilities, behavior disorders, youth who are from lower socio- economic backgrounds, and youth who are LGBTQ2S+. We want all youth to feel that they belong and feel safe.



CANCER CARE OF NCW

Our House Revitalization Project

Cancer Care of NCW provides Our House, a healthcare hospitality house for out-of-town cancer patients needing a place to stay while receiving treatment in Wenatchee. We also offer social services for regional and local cancer patients with payment assistance for medications, food, travel/lodging, and one-time grants for expenses related to treatment and personal situations. We're celebrating our 28th year here in the beautiful Wenatchee Valley, but we need your help. Built in 1999, Our House needs to replace the carpets, countertops, and flooring. Your donation will help us cover the costs of materials and installation during the Our House revitalization project.



CASCADE FISHERIES

Our Salmon Need Your Help!

Wild salmon and steelhead are on the brink of extinction in North Central Washington. Over the past 20 years, Cascade Fisheries has improved fish survival by removing migration barriers blocking over 50 miles of streams, replanting streamside forests, and restoring stream habitat. Our community-based engagement & education programs reach thousands of students each year and since 2016 we have connected over 14,000 individuals to roles in salmon recovery. Your donation will help continue and expand our exceptional salmon in the classroom and watershed stewardship programs and support the restoration of critical salmon habitats.



CASCADE MEDICAL FOUNDATION

Expanding and Improving Community AEDs

Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) save lives of victims of sudden cardiac arrest when they are accessible. The greater Leavenworth area has 15 AEDs provided by Cascade Medical that are nearing end of useful life. We want to replace and add more AEDs that have upgrades including continued compression during echocardiogram rhythm analysis, dual language capacity in English and Spanish, WiFi connectivity (which allows EMS to know shocks given and patient ECG before arriving on scene), and maintenance alerts sent to remote monitors. We're raising funds to increase the number and quality of AEDs both downtown and in outlying activity hubs near Peshastin, Dryden and Lake Wenatchee. This project also includes hosting short, free trainings on AED use and a public awareness campaign of AED locations.




CHELAN-DOUGLAS CASA
Help Changes a Child's Story

CASA believes that every child who has experienced abuse or neglect deserves to have a dedicated advocate speaking up for their best interest in court, at school, and in our community. To accomplish this, Chelan Douglas CASA educates and empowers a group of dedicated community volunteers who ensure each child's needs remain a priority in an over-burdened and complex child welfare system. When the state steps in to protect a child's safety because the people responsible for protecting them have not, a judge appoints a trained, qualified CASA volunteer to make independent and informed recommendations that help the judge decide what's best for the child.




CHELAN DOUGLAS COMMUNITY ACTION COUNCIL
Food Distribution Center

Chelan Douglas Community Action Council is building a new Food Distribution Center to meet the nutritional needs of our neighbors throughout Chelan and Douglas County for the next 30 years. CDCAC has been the regional food bank for over 50 years, ensuring our food pantries and meal sites have the food products they need to assist others. Our current warehouse facility is a 5,000 square foot warehouse with old cooler and freezer storage units, about 250 square feet each. The community need is far greater than our current facility can accommodate and we are preparing to construct a new 14,000 square foot facility that will include new 1,000 square foot cooler and freezer units, expanded dry storage space, meeting space for staff and volunteers, and a commercial kitchen for processing locally gleaned fruit and vegetable products. In addition to our twenty contracted food pantries and meal site programs, we operate a mobile food pantry that brings fresh, frozen, and dry food products to remote communities and isolated neighborhoods.



ALANO CLUB OF WENATCHEE
Drug and Alcohol Recovery Club

For 48 years, The Alano Club of Wenatchee has benefited the community by providing people a safe supportive environment to support their recovery. The club offers two meeting rooms and a commons area. People can attend an AA or NA meeting, attend a small book study group, meet with their sponsor to work on 12 step program or discuss any recovery issues, and volunteer for service work. The club is dedicated to creating a recovery community where recovering addicts can come together and enjoy clean time/sobriety. In addition to accessing resources, having space for peers to come together is important because it promotes healthy relationships, fellowship, and long-term recovery. Your donation will support building maintenance and events that give people hope and a road to recovery.

CHILDREN'S HOME SOCIETY

The Readiness to Learn Program (RTL) and Social Service in School
 The Readiness to Learn (RTL) program provides support to children at risk of academic failure. Staff provide a range of services to help children be successful. Staff offer education and support to parents and work individually with children both at schools and in the community. This program reduces barriers to learning, strengthens engagement, and ensures that all children can attend school ready to learn. The Social Services in School (SSS) program provides educational support to children transitioning from juvenile detention back to public schools. Education Advocates additionally provide educational support to at-risk students.



GARDEN TERRACE

50th Anniversary Capital Campaign
 Garden Terrace has quietly served critical housing needs of low-income seniors in North Central Washington for 50 years. GREATER LEAVENWORTH MUSEUM

Preserving and Protecting Local Heritage
 The history of Leavenworth is the story of grit, determination, and unwillingness to fail. The Greater Leavenworth Museum tells that story from the First Peoples to the coming of the railroads, to mining and agriculture, and finally, to our transformation to the Bavarian Village. In 2021, we also began hosting the Northwest Ski Hall of Fame, celebrating Pacific Northwest athletes who were instrumental in transforming winter sports nationwide. GREEN OKANOGAN

Recycling Storage Facility

Keeping product dry is essential for items to be recycled, so it is time for us to move forward and build a storage facility. Currently, we are covering bales of cardboard with tarps which is difficult, inefficient and dangerous as workers climb atop the bales to position the tarps. Our proposed design features a 50' x 40' metal building that will hold 6 baled rows of cardboard, plastic, aluminum and tin. This will allow us to store products easily and keep them dry. Estimated cost of the building is \$75,000, so we are going to need your help to get it built. We have already recycled 1.5 million pounds in north Okanogan County, but there is plenty more to go.



HAND IN HAND IMMIGRATION SERVICES

Helping Immigrant Families to Obtain U.S. Citizenship

Hand in Hand is a trusted place where immigrants can get accurate, up-to-date information on the citizenship process and clarification of their requirements. Legal assistance is conducted by case workers who have been accredited by the Department of Justice. We provide guidance through our 10 step program and free tutoring classes, both online in person. In order for us to keep our low cost application fee and pro-bono applications available we do need supporters like yourself to keep this program running and helping US residents become US citizens.



HERITAGE HEIGHTS

Taking Care of Our Own


Heritage Heights is determined to fill the gap and make sure our families can stay together, our seniors can be in familiar surroundings and our valley can care for its own. Expanding services at Heritage Heights to include memory care will benefit current residents, future residents, and families across the North Central Washington region in several ways. First, it will provide a service not offered in the service area market. Second, adding memory care will create a continuum of care that allows clients to maintain a stable residence as they age. Third, a local facility that offers memory care means residents will not have to transfer to Wenatchee, Yakima, or Spokane for services, which in turn reduces the amount of out-of-area travel for family members who wish to visit their loved one.



HOPE CARE CLINIC

Happier and Healthier Smiles with Better Oral Hygiene!

The Hope Care Clinic wants to focus on restarting the Oral Hygiene program and continue with a much needed service for the NCW community. We will offer free oral cancer screenings and oral health education to the public especially to those who are underserved and may lack access to oral healthcare due to economic hardships. We are committed to emphasizing the important role of oral health in the overall health of the individual and eliminating disparities of care, which have only been made worse by the pandemic.

Chelan Valley Hope envisions a Chelan Valley where all people in need are compassionately connected with timely relief and relevant resources. MOUNTAIN MEADOWS

Tackling COVID One Day at a Time!

Mountain Meadows Senior Living Campus is the only non-profit senior living community in the Leavenworth area and one of few in the Upper Valley to accept Medicaid reimbursement. We are always focused on ways to improve the quality of life and care for our residents. This year, we have a need for minor medical equipment – individual vital signs devices for each resident and a portable vital signs machine for general use. The goal is to improve efficiency and time management for the care staff and to further enhance infection control measures. We also need to update our Assisted Living dining room chairs - our current dining chairs are starting to show their age, especially with the repeated need to sanitize. The new chairs we are wishing to acquire are very durable and easily sanitized daily. The total cost for these purchases is \$30,000.



MOUNTAIN SPROUTS

Natural Playground

Mountain Sprouts is a nature based preschool serving children ages 3-7 at our two campuses in the Cascade Mountains. Our mission is to provide children of all abilities and from diverse backgrounds the opportunity to be fully engaged in their natural environment and to enjoy purposeful and productive play experiences which promote physical, social, emotional and intellectual growth. We are looking forward to improving our outdoor spaces/playgrounds to include natural raised beds, a potting station, biodegradable pots, and composting bins. We are excited to build a butterfly garden and bird houses to study the creatures around us. We love the idea of children learning the science of growing food and being nourished by the food they grow. We are interested in purchasing equipment to collect and store rainwater for our garden. The process of collecting water and gardening helps students develop collaboration skills, problem solving skills, observation skills, and communication skills.



NUMERICA PERFORMING ARTS CENTER

Every Kid at the PAC (EKAP)

After being closed for 18 months the Numerica PAC is back! Our mission is rooted in being an accessible center that educates, empowers, and inspires our community. One way we achieve this is our Every Kid at the PAC (EKAP) program. Before closing our doors, EKAP saw 5,608 students from 11 different districts come through our center in a single school year. This program helps improve the quality of life and educational experience for our underprivileged youth. The programming selected for EKAP is chosen in conjunction with classroom curriculum.



OKANOGAN BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE

Highland Clubhouse

Highland Clubhouse is a safe, supportive, and stigma-free place where individuals who are in recovery from mental illness, substance use disorders, and/or experiencing developmental disabilities can learn to live and thrive as full members of our community. Membership is free and open to anyone age 18 or older. While the Clubhouse was during Covid-19, the Covid-Safe Connections project delivered four nutritionally-balanced meals and activity supplies to about 25 homebound and economically disadvantaged members each week. The deliveries not only provided the opportunity for staff members to check on members' well-being, they provided the comfort and reassurance of human interaction.



OKANOGAN COUNTY CHILD DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION

Change the Lives of Children and Families

OCCDA is changing the lives of children and families everyday through wrap-around services designed to promote parents as the first and most important teachers of their children, ensure kindergarten readiness, and develop family resiliency. Your donation will help put books in the hands of young children through our Dolly Parton's Imagination Library Affiliate; support our families who have emergent needs that our funding doesn't cover, including, gas, diapers, warm clothes, and food; and provide for additional needs in our classroom and home visiting programs.



OKANOGAN LAND TRUST

Connecting Land and Community
From the Cascades to the Kettles, Canada to the Columbia, Okanogan Land Trust is a local nonprofit organization connecting people to the land and conserving and sustaining our working farms and ranches, wildlife habitats, and water resources for generations to come. Our building was donated to OVOC one year ago. We appreciate having this space to store and build sets and props for musicals, store and create costumes, store music and supplies for concerts and to have a place for our Board and committee members to meet together. Many repairs have been made. The OVOC Board is hoping to fund a very necessary FACELIFT for this building. A clean and freshly painted building would be more pleasing and inviting to the community, especially with its location in downtown Okanogan. The OVOC Board hopes that our community will see this building as OVOC's HOME, to be used as a meeting place for its members and performers in the future

Technology Center and Core Operations


We're all about building Hope, Skills and Resilience! This year we've helped get funds to 40+ households for rent/utility assistance and 300 food boxes delivered to those in quarantine. We are providing access to online classes in Early Childhood Education certification and plan to offer English as a Second Language through Wenatchee Valley College. WorkSource is back on site offering employment services each week, connecting workers with jobs and upskill training with access to our tech center. Your support will help fund our core operations, further develop our technology center for education and business incubation, improve our counseling space, and take next steps to build our commercial kitchen.



POWERHOUSE MINISTRIES

Low Barrier Shelter for Anyone in Need

PowerHouse Ministry is the only low-barrier shelter in Wenatchee Valley, open to all people from 9am-5pm Monday-Friday serving 20-70 people for a few minutes or all day in a safe and calming environment with free help for any needs. We serve each and every person in our community who are dealing with problems such as alcoholism, drug addiction, mental illness, poverty, gangs, and homelessness. We are seeing more families in need and working people losing their homes during the crisis we are all still facing today. We believe every single person deserves respect, love, and a helping hand up when they need it.



PYBUS MARKET FOUNDATION

West Side Revitalization Project

The next step in Pybus Public Market's journey towards becoming the best place for our community to meet is to create a permanent home for the Wenatchee Valley Farmers Market (WVFM) and a more pedestrian-safe parking lot. This is crucial for the long-term health of our valley. All of our farmers are local, so the income from the Farmer's Market stays in our community, providing jobs and income for people who are living right here. Another important demographic reached is community members who are part of the WIC or EBT programs - WVFM's presence here means they have access to fresh produce and products they might otherwise not have an opportunity to have.



SERVE WENATCHEE

Let's Make HOPE Contagious!

OKANOGAN REGIONAL HUMANE

Spay it Forward

OKRH has opened a new spay/neuter clinic for cats and dogs, serving all low-income people in the entire Okanogan Region. Spay and neuter is the only answer to pet overpopulation. Here is just one of the hundreds of stories from this year: Sweets is ready for adoption, except for two things; he needs to be neutered and he needs eye surgery. Sweets had been found hanging around a feral cat colony, he was timid, but did not run when approached. The caretaker was worried and wondered if he was lost or had been abandoned. She brought Sweets to the OKRH clinic. This friendly kitty will get the surgery and care that he needs, then go to a partner shelter for adoption. With assistance, OKRH can continue to help animals in need.



OUR VALLEY OUR FUTURE

Five Year Action Plan

Our Valley Our Future / Nuestro Valle Nuestro Futuro (OVOF) brings together community members who create an "Action Plan" based on input and data collected from thousands of residents. OVOF then coordinates with partnering organizations across the region to turn the Action Plan's projects and programs into reality. Since 2017, the partnering organizations have landed grants totaling tens of millions of dollars for those projects and programs. In early 2022, OVOF will release its second five-year Action Plan, this one for the years 2022-26. OVOF will be hard at work helping move projects and programs developed by community members forward, including convening people and facilitating conversations, collaborating with organizations, gathering additional data, and communicating successes.



SAGE (SAFETY, ADVOCACY, GROWTH EMPOWERMENT)

Crime Victims Crisis Center of Chelan and Douglas Counties

SAGE is the crime victims crisis center of Chelan and Douglas Counties. SAGE has 4 main programs including Domestic Violence Services, Sexual Assault Services, Crime Victims Trauma Center and the Child & Family Advocacy Center. SAGE provides free and confidential services to anyone who has been a victim of crime. Services available at SAGE include: advocacy, counseling, emergency shelter, information and referral, safety planning help with protection orders, community education, professional training, 24 hour crisis line, a teen text line, support groups, food basket, diapers, wipes, and a hygiene closet. SAGE is 100% grant and donation funded.



SMALL MIRACLES

Food That's In When School Is Out
1 in 6 children in America worry about their next meal. Hunger deprives kids of more than food, it also impacts their mental and physical health. Poverty is complicated, but feeding a child is not. For 10 years, Small Miracles have been feeding children during the gaps when area schools' free and reduced breakfast/lunch programs are not available. Over 1,000 local children qualify and are at risk of going without. Serving communities in Rock Island, Wenatchee, East Wenatchee, Monitor, and Cashmere, we strive to provide all children with USDA approved nutritious breakfast and lunch meals.



STAGE KIDS

Help Create the Beacon Hill Grange Blackbox Theater!

Help us preserve and enhance a beloved community gem AND support the creation of an amazing new performance space! The Beacon Hill Grange in Sunnyslope has been a gathering place for our community for generations. Today, Stage Kids is proud and blessed to continue that legacy, filling the Grange almost daily with kids and families coming together to learn, laugh, and grow through the power of musical theater. The Grange was built with a beautiful (but now outdated) stage, and today, we're asking for your help to develop that space into a black box theater capable of producing small but mighty performances for youth by youth! Community Harvest Gleaning Program


