ALANO CLUB OF WENATCHEE

Alano Club of Wenatchee has been serving communities in Chelan and Douglas counties for almost 50 years! It is the only organization in the valley open seven days a week for individuals in, or seeking, substance recovery. As a recovery community organization, we are led and governed by people with, or connected to, lived experience. The Club provides a safe, social, supportive environment for peer-to-peer support; recovery meetings, social events, and activities; educational presentations and workshops; and staffed with recovery coaches to aid and assist with recovery plans and community referrals for education, employment, housing, behavioral health, and treatment. The Club advocates and partners with other community organizations focused on building the recovery community and expanding the support network to individuals in need. Help Expand Resources to Reach More Youth in Our Community

Camp Zanika is the ideal location for kids to learn new skills, have fun, make friends, and create memories that will last a lifetime. Youth will also experience the great outdoors firsthand (and unplugged) with guided explorations of our trails, lakes, and woods. These past 3 years we have learned how essential peer to peer interaction and time spent outdoors is for youth development. Last summer Camp Fire NCW/Camp Zanika gave over \$27,000 in summer camp scholarships. We believe every child deserves to experience summer camp regardless of economic status. Evidence suggests that youth who attend summer camp gain a sense of self-worth and emotional intelligence. Our diversity inclusion program coordinator will ensure an environment of inclusiveness for kids with a wide variety of abilities and support needs.



CANCER CARE OF NCW

Our House: A Healthcare Hospitality House for Cancer Patients

Since 1993, Cancer Care of North Central Washington has provided a healthcare hospitality house for cancer patients traveling to Wenatchee for treatment. This home-away-from-home is known as Our House. We also provide social services for any regional cancer patients in need such as with payment assistance for medications or food, travel/lodging costs, and one-time grants for expenses related to treatment and/or personal situation. As we head into our 30th anniversary, our goal is to provide enhanced services and support for those battling cancer in North Central Washington. CASCADE FISHERIES

Salmon Need Your Help!

Wild salmon and steelhead in our region are on the brink of extinction, the time to help is now! Over the past 22 years, Cascade Fisheries has improved salmon survival by removing migration barriers, replanting streamside forests, restoring instream habitat, and engaging and educating our communities. Since 2016 we have connected over 19,000 individuals from diverse communities to our salmon recovery efforts. Our K-12 education programs reach thousands of students each year providing the experience of raising salmon in classrooms and developing ways to save salmon. CASHMERE MUSEUM & PIONEER VILLAGE

Help Change a Child's Story


In an overburdened and complex child welfare system, having a caring adult advocating for their best interests can make a lasting difference for a child who has experienced abuse or neglect. A trained and qualified Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) will get to work on gathering information, making recommendations, and reporting their findings to the court. When children have a CASA, they are more likely to find a safe, permanent home, succeed in school, be half as likely to re-enter the foster care system, and have an opportunity to thrive. As one CASA states, "Being a CASA has meant investing in hope for a child's bright future." Your gift benefits every child who has been removed from their home due to abuse or neglect by guaranteeing that no vulnerable and at-risk child is left without a voice, or their needs overlooked.

Food Distribution Center


We distribute approximately 2.5 million pounds of food each year to 22 food pantry and meal sites with fresh fruit and produce, dry goods, canned products, and frozen beef, poultry, pork and seafood items. We are the primary source of nutritious food items for each pantry. Many rural areas of Chelan and Douglas County do not have a food pantry, but are supported by our Mobile Food Pantry. Our gleaning and Farm to Food Bank program contracts with 65 area farmers, providing a source for gleaned products to reach families rather than produce going to waste, plus a program to support local farmers by purchasing products directly from them to supplement U.S. and Washington State commodities. We are committed to ensure a vibrant and resilient hunger relief network in Chelan and Douglas County!

Our New Green Building

Green Okanogan has been providing recycling and reuse services to North Okanogan County since 2015. This past summer, with the help of our community, we were able to build a beautiful 50' x 50' storage building to keep our product dry. Our "Green Building" is perfect but we had to take out a \$50,000 loan to pay for it. All donations to GiveNCW will go towards repayment of this loan.

Throughout NCW, there are thousands of legal permanent residents who have lived and worked in our communities for decades who just need help and encouragement to navigate the citizenship process. Since 2000, Hand in Hand Immigration Services has been a trusted place where local families turn to get accurate, up-to-date information on the citizenship process. Last year, Hand in Hand helped 100 legal permanent residents with their naturalization. This year Hand in Hand has helped 126 people, currently legally residing in our communities, to enjoy the full benefits of US citizenship – including exercising their right to vote and having a voice in our democracy. Our team of trained staff and volunteers can provide the knowledge and support they need to take that final step of reaching the American Dream. At Hope Care Clinic, we have the privilege to provide quality, compassionate medical, dental, and behavioral healthcare services to low-income, uninsured and underinsured adults in the NCW community and its surrounding areas. We partner with local working and retired dentists, medical providers, counselors, nurses, etc. Due to a significant rent increase, we had an unforeseen move to a new facility, which was complicated by the retrofit expenses and multiple setbacks, causing an extended closure. The importance of our vital work and access to affordable care has never been more pressing and apparent until now as we have a lengthy list of patients waiting to provide the appropriate care which they would otherwise do without due to economic and other barriers.

The Indigenous Roots and Reparation Foundation is an Indigenous lead nonprofit established to preserve history, culture, traditions and language through education and advocacy. One of our main goals is to continue to create a space on our ancestral homelands to gather in community. In the Wenatchi Valley, Indigenous people have no designated space. We envision in our future a community center space as a place where we can gather with our relatives. In our rural valley with few public transportation options, Native people have to travel long distances to access resources, whether they are seeking traditional medicine or educational resources. Huckleberry Camp is designated for tribal members, providing an opportunity to be out on the land with relatives. With a huge initial signup in 2022, we are seeking options for 2023.

Create. Connect. Collaborate.



The NCW Community Toy Drive's mission is to ensure children in need in Chelan, Douglas, and Okanogan counties receive a special gift during the Christmas season. In recent years, we have seen an increase in the number of teens becoming a part of the distribution, as well as homeless youth. This last season we were able to provide gifts for 129 homeless teens. With the continued impact on the economy, we are anticipating another increase in the numbers served for the teens age group. Many community families will have unmet needs for their children.



NORTH VALLEY HOSPITAL FOUNDATION

Helping to Grow Local Health Care
Our North Valley Hospital district serves a sparse population in the Okanogan region with its Critical Access Hospital, whole family health clinic, 2 therapy clinics, and an extended care facility. NVH Foundation members are proud to assist this high quality and personalized patient care standard. For the Extended Care residents who are prone to falling out of bed, NVHF supplied special low beds that can lower to the floor which eliminated the need for hospital-like safety rails. To keep minds and bodies active, a full Activities Cart was stocked last year. The handicap bus purchased accommodates wheelchair passengers, along with seating for up to 12 others. NVHF supports the medical staff by funding scholarships, for employees and a newly enrolled medical student. NVHF works to make a difference in our local health care.



NORTHWEST IMMIGRANT RIGHTS PROJECT

Protecting Families, Strengthening Communities

Many immigrants in our community face deportation and separation from their families simply because they cannot afford an attorney. Since there is no right to an attorney in immigration court, low-income immigrants who have a legal right to remain here must navigate the complex immigration legal system alone. With your help, this project will provide legal representation so they can access protections for which they qualify under law. Your support will ensure that members of our community—regardless of how much money they have or where they were born—will be protected from violence, stay together with their families, and have opportunities in work and education. Our Vision: Northwest Immigrant Rights Project strives for justice and equity for all. Our Values and Principles: Dignity, Fairness, Solidarity, Self-Determination, Safety, and Inclusion.

Keep the Arts Alive in Downtown Wenatchee

Located in the heart of downtown Wenatchee at the Stanley Civic Center, the Numerica Performing Arts Center offers something for everyone year-round in an intimate 550-seat venue. Pull back the curtain, and you may see your neighbor dancing, singing, acting, playing, or working behind the scenes on the Numerica PAC stage and consider it home to the creative side of them that brings them joy. Step into the box office, and you may hear a patron asking when a speaker who moved them to tears or a musician who inspired their teenage nostalgia will return. Pass through the lobby, and you may experience the wonder in a child's eyes at seeing the magic of the arts, literature, or science come alive – perhaps for the first time ever. Accessible ticket prices and rental income cover less than 50% of the funds needed to maintain and operate the Numerica PAC's facility and organization. OKANOGAN BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE

Highland Center

The Highland Center is a place for personal growth, development and renewal. It's a warm and welcoming environment where individuals can learn to manage their mental health, overcome substance use disorders and/or emotional trauma, and gain living skills while progressing toward their personal definition of success and happiness. Highland Center offers encouragement, supportive social relationships, therapeutic group sessions, and other healing activities, all at no cost to participants. Past Give NCW contributions helped provide home visits, meals and activities to program participants who were isolated and lonely during Covid health and safety restrictions. Inspire a Love for Reading

You can inspire a love of reading. This is your opportunity to help children in Okanogan County and Bridgeport increase their literacy skills through the Dolly Parton Imagination Program. OCCDA is an affiliate for this program, which provides free, age appropriate, quality books mailed to each child's home every month. Before receiving books from our program, 40% of registered parents had 10 or less books in their homes and 27.5% of parents read to their children once a week or less. Since receiving books, 87.5% of parents report reading to their children three times a week or more and 70% of parents report their children ask to be read to more often. The Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program provides richer home literacy environments, increases children's interest in reading, and helps children develop emerging literacy skills.

Food Pantries in Okanogan

Food pantries in Okanogan County have been experiencing food shortages as a result of the increased demand during the pandemic and high rates of inflation. Food, gas, and other basic necessities are more expensive, forcing people to make decisions on how to cover higher heating bills, rent, and costs for daily living. The Okanogan County Community Action Council is collecting donations to help support 9 food pantries in Okanogan County. Okanogan County remains one of the most distressed counties in Washington State with 25% of its residents living at or below the poverty level. When you are lost, cold, hungry, or injured, hours seem like days, and days seem like a lifetime. The ability to respond rapidly to a lost or injured person incident requires incredible dedication from an all-volunteer organization like OCSAR. Many hours of training are needed, the calls rarely come at a convenient time, and the missions can be long. Experienced searchers know that when someone is in trouble, they must drop everything, grab their gear, and go. This level of commitment is required of our members and is rare in volunteer organizations. If you are lost or injured in the woods or the mountains, we are there for you 24/7. Ground searchers, dog team, rope-rescue, water response, drones, and more. Please help keep us sharp. Help fund our ongoing training needs.



OKANOGAN HIGHLANDS ALLIANCE

Restoring and Protecting Nature in the Okanogan Highlands

Engaging our community in the protection and restoration of the natural environment is core to Okanogan Highlands Alliance's mission. Amid the unique and diverse landscapes of northeastern Okanogan County, OHA encourages education about the natural world. We seek to spark appreciation for the land, ecosystems and wildlife, and energize people to make choices and take actions that conserve resources and protect clean water and natural habitats. OHA advocates for measures to clean up pollution at the now-closed gold mine on Buckhorn Mountain, restores habitat and wetland function on Myers Creek, stewards a 65-acre Wetland and Wildlife Preserve on the south end of Lost Lake, and invites the community to learn about, care for, advocate for, and recreate in the Okanogan Highlands throughout the year.

Okanogan Regional Humane has been working tirelessly to provide low cost spay/neuter and emergency veterinary care to Okanogan region. This year many animal welfare organizations were overwhelmed with the number of unintentional litters of cats and dogs surrendered or in need of veterinary care. ORH exists to try to prevent the overwhelming number of surrendered animals flooding shelters that was experienced this year. Veterinary care can be a cost that many families can not afford, which has contributed to the current animal rescue crisis. Spay and neuter programs are the only way to stop the overpopulation at the source. The reservoir is full. It is time to turn off the faucet.
